### **Piano Cleveland announces First Round contestants for its 2026 Cleveland International Piano Competition for Young Artists**

**CLEVELAND, OH** - Piano Cleveland, host of the Cleveland International Piano Competition for Young Artists, has announced the 50 contestants, ages 10-18, who will play during its First Round this March. The Preliminary Jury, a diverse panel of leading figures in the piano world comprised of concert pianists and renowned professors, reviewed the applications and audition videos of 311 contestants to select the 50 young pianists who will compete in the competition's three age divisions: Rising Stars (ages 10-12), Juniors (ages 13-15), and Seniors (ages 16-18).

"The Cleveland International Piano Competition for Young Artists showcases the best emerging artists in the classical piano world," says Piano Cleveland Artistic Director, Yaron Kohlberg. "Our competition allows audiences to see tomorrow's pianists today."

Indeed, past Cleveland International Piano Competition for Young Artists medalists include Yunchan Lim, Eva Gevorgyan, and Ryan Wang—each of whom is now a known world-class pianist. Piano Cleveland also maintains close ties to its laureates. For example, this May, Cleveland International Piano Competition for Young Artists 2015 medalist Chaeyoung Park will return to Cleveland as part of the organization's music series, Piano Cleveland Live. According to Kohlberg, it's one of the many ways the competition has a lasting impact on the careers of its contestants.

First Round contestants will record a solo recital in one of three locations: Cleveland, Ohio; Hamburg, Germany; and Beijing, China. The First Round recordings will be broadcast on the Piano Cleveland website, [pianocleveland.org](http://pianocleveland.org), and its YouTube channel from March 26-29. Thirteen young artists will advance to the Semi-Final Round held in Cleveland this July: three contestants from the Rising Star division and five pianists from each of the Junior and Senior divisions. All Semi-Finalists will have the unique opportunity to perform solo recitals and collaborate with professional chamber musicians.

Competition innovation has become the hallmark of Piano Cleveland's competitions. "Our audiences expect us to offer new competition practices," says Kohlberg. "We're excited to offer a Final Masterclass Round with Jean Yves-Thibaudet—a first in the piano competition sphere." Thibaudet, one of the world's leading classical piano luminaries, has his competition roots in Cleveland, winning second prize at the Robert Casadesus International Piano Competition (later rebranded as the Cleveland International Piano Competition) in 1979.



Six finalists – three from the Junior Division and three from the Senior Division – will participate in the one-of-a-kind Masterclass with Jean-Yves Thibaudet on July 29, as well as perform concerto movements with The Canton Symphony Orchestra on July 31. The Final Round with Orchestra will be broadcast on Amadeus.tv as well as [pianocleveland.org](http://pianocleveland.org).
